HB389 - Patron Confidentiality

In July 2000, the Ohio General Assembly approved a new law that effects you as a library patron. This law (referred to as HB389) is a patron confidentiality law that protects your privacy. What this new law means is that your library records as an adult or juvenile patron are protected, and information about your library usage can only be given to you or to someone you designate as having access to your library record (a designated borrower). Designated borrowers must be 18 years of age or older. For children under 18 years of age, only their parents, legal guardians, or legal custodians can access their information without permission or authorize designated borrowers for their children.

For your convenience, you may authorize designated borrowers who may check out, renew, pick up holds, and pay fines for you. These individuals will be required to show a picture ID.
